**FORMAL COMPLAINT REGARDING HUMANITARIAN MISCONDUCT AND
INSTITUTIONAL MALPRACTICE**

Excellency,

I am writing to you in my capacity as a professional journalist, a member of the British Computer Society (MBCS), and the founder of *Jour News Media*. As a dedicated advocate for humanitarian principles, the protection of asylum seekers, and the integrity of the journalistic profession, I feel compelled to bring to your urgent attention a series of systemic abuses occurring under the guise of "safeguarding" by organizations operating within the humanitarian sector, specifically *Choose Love* and *No Name Kitchen (NNK)*.

My professional investigations into the conditions of migrants and asylum seekers in Sjenica, Serbia, have uncovered disturbing patterns of misconduct. These organizations, which claim to provide support, have instead engaged in discriminatory practices, financial opacity, and institutional mismanagement. Furthermore, I have documented instances of unethical behavioral conduct among volunteers and coordinators—including incidents involving sexual activities in volunteer quarters—which severely undermine the very protection mandates they profess to uphold.

The institutional response to these findings has been to engage in bureaucratic mobbing, intimidation, and unauthorized attempts to access my confidential psychological records. This behavior is not only a violation of personal privacy but a direct attempt to suppress journalistic inquiry and whistleblowing.

Additionally, my reporting on corruption related to SOCAR (State Oil Company of the Azerbaijan Republic) and its impact on my personal security has made me a target. I have been subjected to direct threats of physical violence from representatives associated with state-linked interests. The efforts by *Choose Love* and *NNK* to silence my inquiries, including the arbitrary freezing of my communication channels under false pretenses of "translation issues," suggest a coordinated effort to obfuscate reality.

The current state of operations by these organizations in Sjenica and elsewhere is untenable. They have operated with a lack of transparency, failed to address the legitimate grievances of the migrant population, and demonstrated a total disregard for the standards of accountability required of humanitarian actors.

Given the gravity of these matters—which include corruption, threats to life, and gross negligence in safeguarding—I formally request that the United Nations initiate an independent inspection and research into the operations of *Choose Love* and *NNK*. It is imperative that these entities be held accountable to the high standards of humanitarian service they purport to represent.

I remain at your disposal to provide extensive documentation, testimonies, and evidence to support this request. I trust that the United Nations will prioritize the protection of vulnerable populations and the integrity of those defending human rights.
